Today we celebrate the feast of the Exaltation of the Cross. The feast of the holy Cross began in the year 335, when churches in Jerusalem, built on the sites of the crucifixion and Resurrection of Christ, were dedicated. It became a major feast, and any Christian who could make the pilgrimage to Jerusalem would try to be there for the celebration. The Cross is for us the channel of God's love, mercy, forgiveness and healing. It leads to the resurrection and the promise of eternal life.

This month we are celebrating the 'Season of Creation', which over recent years has become a global ecumenical celebration of prayer and action to protect our common home, starting each year on $\mathbf{1}^{\text{st}}$ September and finishing on the feast of St Francis, $\mathbf{4}^{\text{th}}$ October. Readings for the Feast of The Exaltation of the Holy Cross

First reading

Numbers 21:4b-9

In those days: The people became impatient on the way. And the people spoke against God and against Moses, 'Why have you brought us up out of Egypt to die in the wilderness? For there is no food and no water, and we loathe this worthless food.' Then the Lord sent fiery serpents among the people, and they bit the people, so that many people of Israel died. And the people came to Moses and said, 'We have sinned, for we have spoken against the Lord and against you. Pray to the Lord, that he take away the serpents from us.' So Moses prayed for the people. And the Lord said to Moses, 'Make a fiery serpent and set it on a pole, and everyone who is bitten, when he sees it, shall live.' So Moses made a bronze serpent and set it on a pole. And if a serpent bit anyone, he would look at the bronze serpent and live.
