The 'true love' is God; the 'partridge in a pear tree' is Jesus; the 'two turtle doves' are the old and new testaments; the 'three French hens' are the three virtues of Faith, Hope and Charity; the 'four calling birds' are the four gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke and John; the 'five gold rings' are the first five books in the Old Testament; the 'six geese' are the six days of creation; the 'seven swans' are the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit; the 'eight maids' are the eight beatitudes; the 'nine ladies' are the nine fruits of the Holy Spirit; the 'ten lords' are the ten commandments; the 'eleven pipers' relate

to the eleven faithful apostles; and the 'twelve drummers' are the twelve points of doctrine in the apostles creed.

We remember those who are sick and housebound in the parish and all whose anniversaries occur at this time of the year.

### Gospel

Matthew 2:13-15, 19-23
