We extend a warm welcome to those visiting the parish this weekend.

Tea/coffee is served in the hall after the Sunday Mass at Leiston. All welcome.

Children's Worksheets (LOOK) are available at the back of church. They are based on the Sunday readings.

This Sunday is known as Gaudete Sunday and traditionally rose colour vestments are worn. It marks that we are over half-way through our Advent journey. The latin word 'gaudete' means 'rejoice' and is the first word of the entrance antiphon for today's Mass: "Rejoice in the Lord always; again, I say rejoice. Indeed, the Lord is near".

Second Collection this weekend for The Dependent Priests' Fund. There are special 'Gift Aid' envelopes at the back of church. This fund supports the sick and retired priests of our diocese. **The O Antiphons:** $(17^{th} - 23^{rd}$ **December).** The final days of Advent are a time of special prayer. The church sings the O Antiphons. These are beautiful chants that are sung at Evening Prayer. They are called O Antiphons because each one begins with the word "O". The antiphons include many of the titles of Christ, such as "Lord," "lawgiver" and "Sun of justice". The well-known hymn "O come, O come, Emmanuel" is a version of the O Antiphons.

Opportunity for The Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession), during Advent at Aldeburgh on Saturday 21st December from 3-4pm.

Collecting for the Foodbank approaching Christmas: Collections from both Churches will continue up until Christmas. Importantly, this year, donations of the **basic foods (non-perishable), household goods and toiletries** would be appreciated. Christmas Masses: On the evening of Tuesday 24th there will be a 6pm Mass at Leiston (family Mass). On Christmas morning there will be the 9.15am Mass at Leiston and 11.00am at Aldeburgh.
