Welcome to anyone who is visiting us this half-term weekend. Coffee etc is served after the Leiston Mass – Come and join us in the hall.

Our prayer for peace and an easing of tensions in the Middle East is so important and to remember those on both sides who have already died and for all those who are mourning the loss of their loved ones, as well as those still being held in hostage. At least there was a sliver of hope on Friday when the two American hostages were released.

I am away this coming week (Monday to Friday) on the annual clergy Retreat. Please keep those attending in your prayers. Sorry, no weekday Masses this week.

Over the coming weeks various works are taking place at the presbytery (decorating etc) and emergency lighting was installed at Aldeburgh Church three weeks ago and currently gutter repairs are taking place, hence the scaffolding to the rear of the church. These works were all agreed by the diocese and our parish finance committee earlier in the summer

Confirmation: It has been decided to postpone the bishop's visit for Confirmations to next year. It will probably be June, but I will confirm the date as soon as possible. Several names were given to Fr Tony, but some of these may have got lost, so would those wishing to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation please resubmit their names (or submit for the first time) as soon as possible – either by email, or in writing. Normally Confirmation is for those in Year Nine or above, but Year Eight is possible, but no younger, please. We also need a couple of Catechists to prepare our young people for the Sacrament. Any offers to help?
